Purpose

The Legacy Alliance exists to minister to the needs of TK-12 homeschool families, grounded in God's principles and truth. We encourage families who have taken responsibility for their children's education and provide community, programs, activities, and events that support them every step of the way.

We offer a wide variety of complementary core and enrichment classes four days a week, allowing families to select courses that fit their child's unique needs. Our goal is to enrich and support the homeschool community, not to replace it. We are an enrichment program, not a full-time private program.

Legacy's Commitment to You

The Legacy Alliance is committed to connecting our members with a thriving community of homeschooling families and trusted educational vendors. We offer a wide range of enrichment core and elective classes, and we are dedicated to serving your family in alignment with our vision, mission, purpose, and core values. No matter where you are on your homeschool journey, we are here to walk alongside you with support and encouragement.

What Your Membership Includes

Your membership gives your family access to:

- Core and elective enrichment courses for TK–12th grade
- Homeschool support and consulting services to assist with curriculum selection and additional resources
- On-campus and off-campus activities and events year-round
- Clubs, field trips, and community gatherings
- A bi-weekly newsletter
- A members-only website with class resources and communications

Some of our favorite annual events include Makers Markets, a Father-Daughter Dance, Mother-Son Night Out, a Thanksgiving Feast, Movie Night, an Easter Egg Hunt, fundraisers, and holiday celebrations. At Legacy, we are more than an enrichment program, we are a community that genuinely cares.

Our courses are led by diverse, experienced vendors who bring years of expertise and a genuine passion for inspiring curious, enthusiastic lifelong learners. Because parents know their children best, our model lets families build a custom schedule that fits each child's individual learning needs.

Your Relationship with Vendors

One of the great privileges of this community is the partnership between parents and vendors. Each course your family enrolls in is independently operated by an educational vendor who runs their own business. You will pay vendors directly for each class. Payment details are listed under each course description on our website.

We encourage you to invest in genuine relationships with the vendors who come alongside your family. We ask that all communications remain respectful and professional. Questions about a

specific class should always be directed to the individual vendor. If a concern arises that cannot be resolved directly, please contact Legacy Directors and we will do our best to help bring resolution. Vendors are required to notify Legacy of any late or missed payments, and Legacy reserves the right to cancel membership for accounts with outstanding balances.

Charter Families

If you are homeschooling privately, this section does not apply to you.

If you are enrolled in a public charter, please know that The Legacy Alliance operates independently and has no formal relationship with any charter. While some vendors who offer classes at Legacy may also be approved vendors through your charter, Legacy itself is not a charter vendor and should not be listed as one.

If you wish to use charter funds for a class, please communicate directly with your charter. Reference the specific course title and the vendor's name, not The Legacy Alliance, as your charter will not recognize our organization. That arrangement is entirely between you, your charter, and the vendor.

The Legacy Alliance is not affiliated with any charter program.

We are a membership-based ministry providing a central location and community where independent vendors offer enrichment services to homeschool families.

Family Role in Membership

Parent Participation Commitment (PPC)

Every parent is a vital part of what makes Legacy work. Your time and presence on campus are what make this program possible, and they're also what make it feel like family. Each semester, all parents commit to serving in the daily operations of Legacy so our community can thrive together.

Parent Participation Commitment shifts must be registered for before student class registration.

Hours Required

- One track (Monday/Wednesday or Tuesday/Thursday): minimum 12 hours per semester

- Both tracks: (3-4 days a week) minimum 18 hours per semester

To view available shifts, sign into your account and then search for the “Parent Participation Commitment” graphic on the left side. Once there, click on the track you are attending. All shifts and descriptions can be found there.

Primary On-Site Roles

- Campus Setup and Teardown
- Study Hall Monitor
- Front Desk
- Hallway Monitor
- Lunch Monitor

Attendance & Make-Up Policy

- Arriving 15 or more minutes late to a shift requires completing one make-up shift of equal length.
- Missing a shift requires completing the original missed hours plus signing up for one additional shift of the same length.

If a PPC shift is missed, Legacy will contact the family by email and text regarding scheduling a make-up shift. Families will be required to complete the missed shift as well as one additional shift of the same length. If make-up hours are not scheduled within two weeks of notification, an invoice will be added to the family's account at a rate of \$45 per hour for the original missed shift. Failure to meet participation requirements may result in removal from the program/cancellation of membership.

Our Culture of Care

Our goal is to ensure every student always feels seen, loved, and at ease on campus. When you serve at Legacy, we ask that you treat all children as you would your own, creating a space where they feel safe to learn, grow, and make mistakes.

As you serve, you are the eyes and ears of Legacy. You help deepen our culture by keeping bullying and unkind speech out of our community and by modeling genuine kindness and respect. You are empowered to redirect students with grace and firmness, and to encourage reconciliation between peers. If any situation feels beyond your capacity to handle, please reach out to Legacy Staff, we are always here to support you.

Payment

Membership Fee

The only payments made directly to The Legacy Alliance are the semester-based membership fee and any fees for Legacy-operated Study Hall or Lunch periods. These fees cover our operational expenses and help fund community activities and events.

Legacy is not affiliated with any charter and does not accept instructional funds.

All payments to Legacy must be made out of pocket.

Course Fees

Each course is independently operated by an educational vendor, and you will pay vendors directly for each class your child enrolls in. Payment details are listed under each course description on our website. Vendors are very accommodating and typically offer monthly payment plans through PayPal, Venmo, Zelle, check or other convenient methods.

If your vendor is also an approved vendor through your charter, you may inquire with your charter about using those funds directly with that vendor. Legacy is not involved in that process.

Vendors are required to notify Legacy of any late or missed payments. Legacy reserves the right to cancel membership for accounts with outstanding balances.

Scholarship Fund

We want Legacy to be accessible to every family. If you are experiencing financial hardship, we have a scholarship fund available. Details can be found in the Member Resources section on the Legacy homepage.

Behavioral Agreement

Discipline

Legacy's goal is to steward the hearts of God's children while they engage in enrichment programs. We believe parents are best equipped to guide their own children. However, when a student's behavior is disruptive or harmful to other students, vendors, or facilities, Legacy will respond using the following steps:

1. **Verbal Warning:** A staff member, director, or vendor will issue a verbal warning and, when appropriate, encourage reconciliation and better future choices.
2. **Sent to Legacy Staff:** If disruptive behavior continues, the student will be sent to a Legacy staff member and will not return to that period's class. Parents will be contacted.
3. **Parent Pick-Up:** If behavior persists, the parent will be required to pick up their student for the remainder of the day.
4. **Parent Classroom Requirement:** The parent must accompany their student to partner with the vendors and/or Legacy for understanding and to aid their student in managing behavior with a plan of action.

Legacy reserves the right to determine the appropriate step based upon behavior or terminate the membership of any student or family who does not uphold our Code of Conduct, or when repeated offenses occur without change or resolution.

Respect for the Church and Facilities

Legacy students, families, and vendors are expected to treat the campus with care and gratitude. We are deeply thankful for our partnership with the church, and maintaining that relationship is a shared responsibility among all of us.

While accidents happen, any damage or vandalism caused by your child is ultimately the parent's or guardian's responsibility to address and rectify. Legacy will involve parents in any process of property restoration or financial reconciliation. Our goal is to be welcomed back and that depends on all of us treating this space with respect, love, and gratitude.

Weapons and Threats of Violence

Legacy is committed to providing a safe environment for every student, staff member, vendor, and visitor. The possession of weapons and any threats of violence are strictly prohibited on campus and at all Legacy events.

- A weapon is any object designed to inflict harm.
- A threat of violence is any verbal, written, or physical expression implying intent to cause harm to themselves, other people or property.

All incidents or suspicions involving weapons or threats must be reported immediately to Legacy Directors. Violations will result in disciplinary action up to and including removal from the program, and may involve law enforcement as deemed necessary.

Policies & Procedures

Identification Policy

Safety is a top priority at Legacy. Our campus is set apart from public access, and all individuals must check in at the front desk upon arrival with their Legacy photo ID Badge. The only adults permitted on campus during operational hours are church staff, Legacy staff, Legacy vendors, and families of enrolled students.

Member families are required to wear a Legacy photo ID Badge at all times. Church staff wear different badges so they are easily distinguishable. Front desk monitors will check ID badges during drop-off and pick-up. If someone other than a parent is dropping off or picking up a child, they must present the family's ID badge or present their Driver's License (one badge is required per family). Vendors must wear their photo ID badge while on campus, and campus visitors must check in at the Front Desk and wear a Visitor Badge.

One Legacy family badge is included with membership and will be printed and given to families at orientation or on their first week of classes. Additional or replacement badges can be purchased for \$5 each.

Children in TK–3rd grade must wear a lanyard or attached to their backpack on campus at all times with their course schedule attached. Schedule templates are available to print on our website under the Member Resources dropdown [here](#). Lanyards and clear schedule holders may be purchased at Family Orientation or at the Front Desk for \$1 each.

Electronics Policy

Electronics are permitted on campus under adult supervision for the following purposes only:

- **Parent Communication:** A phone or device used solely to contact a parent or guardian. Devices including wired and wireless headphones must remain in backpacks at all times. If a child needs to use their device, they must first find a supervising adult and ask permission to use it. No devices are permitted in bathrooms or private spaces.
- **Educational Purposes:** Devices may be used during Study Hall for homework only, or in a class that specifically requires it. Vendors are responsible for monitoring all screen activity in class. Study Hall monitors will supervise educational device use. Screens must face the supervising adult at all times.

No devices are allowed out on campus, including during passing periods and lunch.

Legacy reserves the right to confiscate any device used outside these guidelines and to dismiss any member without a refund who refuses to comply.

Parents will be notified at pick-up, and only a parent may retrieve a confiscated device.

Illness Policy

Please keep your child home if they are unwell. Students presenting with any of the following will be sent home immediately:

- Fever
- Yellow or green nasal discharge or persistent runny nose
- Persistent cough
- Stomach ache, nausea, vomiting, or diarrhea
- Contagious rash
- Chicken Pox
- Pink eye

Students must be symptom-free and fever-free for a minimum of 24 hours before returning to campus.

Lice Policy

Please notify the Legacy staff immediately if your child has lice, early identification makes it much easier to manage for the whole community. Keep your child home until treatment is complete. Vendors will be notified so that families can be alerted and check their children. The identity of the affected child will not be disclosed. Your child may return after the second application of lice treatment or an official re-check confirms they are clear.

Dress Code

When attending any Legacy on-campus or off-campus event, please ensure all attire is modest and appropriate:

- Shorts, skirts, and dresses must reach at least the point on the thigh where the bottom of a closed fist rests when the arm is extended and laid on the thigh.
- Clothing must not expose the midriff, undergarments, or cleavage. All areas of the stomach and back must be fully covered without pulling or tugging. Prohibited items include sports bras, tube tops, crop tops, and low-cut tops.
- Clothing displaying derogatory language, offensive imagery, or suggestive messages is not permitted.

If a student is not in compliance, a Legacy-issued loaner garment will be provided so they may continue attending. Legacy reserves the right to send home students dressed in inappropriate or distracting clothing. Thank you for partnering with us to create a positive environment for all of our children.

Special Needs & Allergy Policy

If your child has special medical or behavioral needs requiring accommodation, please contact the Executive Director before the semester begins. Legacy is committed to meeting the needs of all families and will do our best to accommodate every member.

We ask all vendors to avoid using peanut products in their classes. However, we cannot control what students bring in personal lunches. If your child has a life-threatening peanut allergy, please communicate with all your student's vendors and supervise your student during lunch. Please tie a bright ribbon to their backpack where their EpiPen is kept so staff and vendors are aware.

Lunch, Study Hall & Vendor Assistant Policy

Lunch and Study Hall are Legacy-supervised periods. A small fee applies to cover the space and associated costs. Students must be enrolled prior to attending either period.

- Study Hall is available for 2nd–12th grade and is limited to one period per day. High Schoolers may enroll in an additional period (2 Study Hall periods in total per day). Please ensure your student has an hour's worth of work to complete. Study Hall Monitors assist students. Any student asked to consistently stay on task will be asked to drop Study Hall and enroll in a class instead.
- Vendor Assistant positions are available for 6th–12th grade students (maximum one position per day, no cost to enroll). Please contact the vendor for approval before enrolling online. If you need volunteer hours documented or a letter of recommendation, speak directly with your vendor.

Food & Water on Campus

Please bring a refillable water bottle to campus each day. Water bottles are available for \$1 in our café for students who forget theirs. If your child is enrolled in the Lunch period, please send a packed lunch, or order a Hot Lunch in advance on our website, or bring money for the café.

Students may eat between periods and during lunch only, not during or in any class. Each student is responsible for throwing away their own trash and cleaning up spills. Please review this expectation with your child. Our shared goal is to leave every space in better condition than we found it.

Student Sales on Campus During Legacy Hours

Students may not sell personal items on campus except during Legacy-sponsored markets or other events specifically approved by Legacy. This policy helps prevent disruptions, ensures fairness, and maintains a positive learning environment for all families.

Families and students are welcome to donate items to be sold through the Legacy Café or Market, with proceeds benefiting Legacy. If interested in participating, please contact a Director.

Off-Campus Events

While Legacy loves building community through off-campus activities and field trips, we are not responsible for any events held off campus and carry no associated liability. Attendance at off-campus events is entirely each family's choice, and all supervision responsibilities rest with the attending family.

Program Details

Check-In & Check-Out

Drop-off begins no earlier than 8:15 a.m. The Legacy program runs from 8:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., and pick-up must be completed by 3:10 p.m. Students will leave classrooms promptly at 3:00pm for pick-up at the Front Desk so vendors can clean/reset their classrooms and our team can turn over the campus efficiently and on time to the church. All vendors and families must be off campus by 4:00 p.m. unless otherwise specified.

TK-1st Grade End of Day Pick-Up

Parents of TK-1st grade students must pick up their child directly from their last class period of the day and check out at the Front Desk before leaving campus (excluding lunch time). Students who leave after lunch will be walked to the front desk for pick-up.

Late Pick-Up Policy

Legacy provides a 15-minute grace period after your child's last class. After the grace period, the following fees will be applied to your account:

- Pick-up after the 15-minute grace period: \$25 late fee
- Pick-up more than 30 minutes past the grace period: \$50 late fee

Late fees are invoiced to your Legacy account. Continued late pick-up may result in further action.

Chapel (Optional)

Chapel is a cherished part of Legacy's ministry. Every morning at 8:30 a.m., before classes begin, we gather for 10–15 minutes for morning announcements, the Pledge of Allegiance, a Bible verse and prayer. Families and vendors are always welcome to join us.

Chapel participation is not mandatory and does not affect membership. If you prefer not to attend, please plan to drop your student off at the start of their first class. Any unsupervised student on campus during Chapel who is not enrolled in a first-period class is required to attend.

Communication

Legacy sends a bi-weekly newsletter to all members with updates on upcoming activities, events, and announcements. Each issue is also posted on the members-only website after it goes out. You can manage your communication preferences in your account settings once logged in.

Clubs

Members are welcome to start and join clubs. Current clubs include a morning Mom's & Prayer and after school Game Club. To start a new club, please contact a Legacy Director.

Activities & Events

For the latest Legacy activities and events, visit our website and click the "Current Events" tab. Our main annual events include our Christmas and Spring Makers Markets, Movie Nights, Jog-A-Thon, Thanksgiving Feast, Father-Daughter Dance, Mother-Son Night Out, Easter Egg Hunt, Muffins with Mom, Legacy Celebrate The Arts, with many more celebrations throughout the year.

We are always looking for parents to join our Event Team, a creative, faith-filled group that designs meaningful and memorable experiences for our students and families. If you have an idea for an event, fundraiser, or activity, please reach out to the Legacy Directors.

Lost & Found

Please label all of your child's belongings clearly and make sure you leave campus with everything you arrived with. Lost items are held for up to one month in our Lost-and-Found, which you can find daily at the Front Desk. At the end of each month, all unclaimed items are donated. Legacy and the church are not responsible for lost or misplaced items.

Disclaimer

Any updates or changes to this Membership Handbook will be communicated through the bi-weekly Legacy newsletter and reflected in the current version on our website.

Code of Conduct

The following must be acknowledged via electronic signature in the registration application by all members of The Legacy Alliance, including staff, vendors, parents, and students. Please read it with your children and make sure they understand these expectations before electronic signing.

Our Code of Conduct is rooted in biblical principles. Legacy partners with families to uphold these standards on campus and at all Legacy events and activities.

As a member of The Legacy Alliance, I agree to:

- Honor and respect my peers by practicing kindness, patience, and peacefulness (Galatians 5:22-23).
- Honor and respect all vendors, staff, monitors, adults, volunteers, and directors (Romans 12:10).
- Use encouraging speech and avoid hurtful, foul, or inappropriate language (Ephesians 4:29).
- Keep my hands to myself and refrain from any aggressive behavior (Matthew 5:9).
- Include others and not exclude anyone from groups, events, clubs or activities (Philippians 2:3).
- Respect the space Legacy occupies and not steal, vandalize, or damage any property.
- Refrain from interfering with any church ministries or offices while on campus (1 Peter 2:17).
- Use the bathroom only for its intended purpose.
- Clean up after myself and others, throwing away my trash and leaving every area nicer than I found it (Matthew 5:16).

Member Terms of Agreement

The following must be acknowledged via electronic signature in the registration application by the parent or guardian only. Students and vendors need only electronic sign the Code of Conduct.

As a member of The Legacy Alliance, I agree to:

- Pay the non-refundable membership fee upon registration (the fee is refundable up until four weeks before the semester start date if you choose not to use our services).
- Pay all vendors on time.
- Pay vendors in full even if I withdraw from a class, as all enrollment is final.
- Fulfill my Parent Participation Commitment. Failure to do so may result in membership being revoked.
- Respect our leased facilities at the church, leaving all areas in better condition than I found them and accepting financial responsibility for any damage caused by myself or my child.
- Refrain from interfering with any church ministries or offices operating on campus.
- Not hold Legacy liable for the health, safety, or education of my child.

Media Release

The following must be acknowledged via electronic signature in the registration application by all members of The Legacy Alliance, including staff, vendors, parents, and students.

I/We give permission for myself and my child's photo and/or video image to be captured during Legacy Alliance classes, activities, field trips, events, and Legacy promotional materials for the purposes of education, training, and program promotion.

It is the practice of The Legacy Alliance to use the likeness (including video, motion pictures, still photographs, voice recordings, and quotations) of students, vendors, volunteers, and staff in publications, digital media, newsletters, films, and other selected formats for the purpose of promoting Legacy and its programs.

Unless a written denial is received from the parent or guardian, enrollment in The Legacy Alliance constitutes legal permission to use such material. This release waives any right to compensation for the use of likeness in any project. To opt out, a written denial letter must be submitted to the Legacy Directors. A new denial must be submitted each academic year.

Adult Waiver and Release of Liability

In consideration of being allowed to participate in any way in The Legacy Homeschool Alliance related events and activities, the undersigned:

1. Agree that the member/participant should inspect the facilities and equipment to be used, and if the member/participant believes anything is unsafe, he or she should immediately advise a supervisor (advisor, manager, director etc.) of such condition(s) and refuse to participate.
2. Acknowledge and fully understand that each member/participant will be engaging in activities that involve risk of serious injury, including permanent disability and death, and severe social and economic losses which might result not only from their own actions, inactions, or negligence but the action, inaction, and negligence of others, or the condition of the premises or of any equipment used. Further, there may be other risks not known to us or not reasonably foreseeable at this time.
3. Assume all the foregoing risks and accept personal responsibility for the damages following such injury, permanent disability or death.
4.
